LINK NEEDS VOLUNTEERS: LINK, an all-volunteer nonprofit coalition of churches and community organizations providing emergency food assistance to needy families in Herndon, Sterling and Ashburn, is looking for volunteers for the tasks below. Please check the list below to see if one of these might fit your schedule and forward to any friends who might be interested. Thank you for your compassion for our neighbors!

- **Food Phone Coordinator** – great job for someone who works from home, is retired or has a flexible work schedule. You would remotely retrieve messages from the LINK answering machine during the 15th – 31st of April, August and December. You would then return calls to the clients and schedule food deliveries (up to 4 a day). LINK delivers food Tuesdays–Saturdays. Total time needed each day is 2 to 3 hours maximum. You volunteer a total of 6 weeks or so a year and you can do it from home!
- **Weekend Food Sorters** – Trader Joe's has generously donated leftover perishable food items to LINK. We are looking for volunteers (or groups) on Saturdays and Sundays to sort through the donated produce, disposing of the spoiled and cleaning other items as needed. This is a great family project or a group volunteer project.
- **Food Donation Pick-up** – Various businesses donate food to LINK. We are looking for drivers to pick up donations from stores Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings.

Thanks for wishes fulfilled so far! Listed below is a list of items we still need loaned or donated for space-themed VBC, July 26 - 30. Please bring your items as soon as possible, because we are working NOW to prepare scenery, decorations, and center activities.

Please please items in or near the VBC tubs located in the Narthex.

Rolls of white butcher paper
Large brown paper bags
Rugs & Blankets (any size) - Gray, brown, tan, rust, gray or black
Tarps - Large blue, brown, and green
Plastic tablecloths -Black or silver plastic
Flat Sheets (any size) –beige, tan, brown, gray, black
Planet mobiles or inflatable planets
Miscellaneous space-theme items for decorating
Cardboard, plastic, or paper 1-sided or 2-sided stars, suns, moons, comets, etc.
Heavy duty aluminum foil, other kinds of silver paper or silver cardboard, any size
Magazine pictures or posters of space scenes, spacecraft, rockets, space stations, shuttle launches, astronauts, telescopes, observatories, etc.
Books, magazines, posters, memorabilia related to astronomy or space travel

Pictures of plants, trees, flowers, animals, sea life, etc. from Genesis Creation story – we need ½-page size for an activity and very large for a display
Certain artificial plants: Most have been supplied; still need asparagus and lima bean!
Large stuffed animals (unusual ones, not teddy bears- Day 1 only). Especially need one each of these:

CDs (for an art project, so recycled old ones are fine)
Yarn – Multi-colored or single colors, of thickness that can go through hole-punched holes
Spray Paint – White, Black, Silver, Brown, Tan, Gray, Gold
Glow-in-the-dark paint
Adhesive-backed magnetic tape
Black and white cardstock
Felt rectangles, various colors
30 half-liter bottles
Dry beans
Glitter Markers
Glitter markers
Silver duct tape
Space-themed stickers
Black and white cardstock
Styrofoam trays
Jingle bells
Foam Brushes
