A NEW CHRISTCARE GROUP IS FORMING! THE SANDWICH GENERATION CHRISTCARE GROUP You are a member of the sandwich generation if you are actively parenting and involved with caring for an aging parent. One in eight Americans between the ages of 40-60 is parenting a child while caring for a parent. Increasingly, people are parenting adult children, caring for a parent, *and* caring for grandchildren. Challenges faced by the sandwich generation include geographic distance between family members, single parenting, demanding jobs, children moving out of the home at an older age than in the past, children returning home, and blended families. In recognition of the number of Trinity members who are part of this generation, a new ChristCare group is forming, with its first meeting *September 19 from 12:15 to 1:30 p.m. in the Parlor*. It will be led by Teresa Dunbar, who led the Caregivers Group at Trinity. All who are caring for an older parent while parenting teenagers, adult children, and/or grandchildren are invited to participate. At this meeting, we will use "The Sandwich Generation" study from the ThoughtfulChristian website. The study offers useful advice as well as hints for involving your children in discussions about your concerns. Group discussion questions will encourage the sharing of experiences and offering each other support. Time will be allowed to discuss preferences for time and place of future meetings.
